Over 250 International Students Study the Russian Language at International Polytechnic Summer School

The Russian language traditionally remains one of the most popular courses of the International Polytechnic Summer School. This year, over 250 young people from Italy, Germany, Norway, France, Mexico, the USA, the Netherlands, China, South Korea and other countries came to study Russian as a foreign language. During several weeks they acquire and improve their communication skills, perform diverse practical exercises, get acquainted with Russian history, art, literature, and discuss news from the world of business and politics.



"Today we are implementing various educational programs on teaching Russian as a foreign language, and the modules of the International Polytechnic Summer School have a special place among them. During the summer months, our students learn the basics of Russian culture, literature, and history, attend speaking clubs, get acquainted with the special features of Russian grammar and vocabulary, study economic and business terminology. It is important to specify that we take into consideration the initial level of knowledge of each student and we choose educational programs in accordance with their individual characteristics," commented V.V. In 2018, within the frame of the International Polytechnic Summer School, there worked more than 20 Russian language study groups of all levels of complexity: from the very basic to advanced ones. Under direction of qualified teachers, the students gain knowledge of alphabet, learn to read and write, compose dialogues, participate in the discussions on various actual topics. On a regular basis, classes are taking place in language labs, where students improve their skills of understanding spoken foreign language, and can hear themselves. There also are particular groups in which the students learn Russian for business and professional communication. A great advantage is that upon graduation from the Summer School its participants can additionally undertake state testing in Russian as a foreign language. It is an easy thing to do because SPbPU has its own authorized Testing Center.



"I've already been studying Russian earlier, and because of this was looking on the Internet for a program or courses where I could improve my knowledge. The most important thing for me was to study in Russia. I liked a lot the description of the Russian language modules at the International Polytechnic Summer School, and here I am. I am delighted with the combination of the practical and cultural components of the module: we have classes during the day time, and in the evening, we go on excursions or walks around St. Petersburg. At the International Polytechnic Summer School I am studying at the basic language level and, of course, I cannot yet freely communicate in Russian. However, I can read street names, tell an address or do the shopping, and this helps a lot to get around the city. Besides this, I met a lot of new friends here and I very much love when we get together and go somewhere. Emma TRENTO (Ca' Foscari University of Venice; Italy) came to Russia to improve her conversational skills.
